## A Zoo for the Phonetic Zoo Cards

Every time your student begins a new lesson, he should receive that lesson's Zoo card to add to his collection. The front of these cards illustrates the rule with an animal whose name uses the spelling rule. The rule or jingle is printed on the back. These cards can be used both as motivational rewards and as reminder cards.

Your student can display the cards on the wall of his room or classroom or place them in plastic baseball card holders. Alternatively, you may wish to paste or print the following pages onto card stock and create six pages serving as a "Phonetic Zoo." The Zoo cards then become "doors" to the "cages." Your student's zoo can reside in a notebook, be pasted on poster board, or be taped on a wall for easy reference.

## Phonetic Zoo Pages

This download provides the pages needed to create your own Phonetic Zoo.

The zoo pages are sorted according to vowels and consonants. The rule category is listed on each page with lesson numbers printed in each box. Thus, the rules for the letter A are all in a row, all the E rules are on one page, and so forth, so that a student can quickly find a rule to review if desired. This is essentially how Anna Ingham organized her "Sound City."

Once your student has his Zoo card and has located the lesson number, he can copy the three reminder words for his level from the large lesson card onto the three lines on the Zoo page. For example, in lesson 1, level A, a student would copy brain, always, and pain; a level B
 student would copy wailing, decay, and sailor; and a level C student would copy ailment, portrayal, and tailored.

If you are the crafty type, use these pages to create a Phonetic Zoo spelling display board or folder. These are only suggestions; you can personalize it as you please.


## Phonetic Zoo POSTER Directions

Apply the print outs provided at the end of this document as illustrated in the picture below.
If you decide to make the display board below, you will need to cut some of the "cage" pages. The page with the Homonyms and Jail gets cut in half, and all the personal spelling cages are separate as well.

The "Homonym of the Week" section includes a plastic sheet protector or baggie cut and pasted so that you can use an index card cut in half for each of the homonyms, which can be slipped in and out of the pouch with ease.


## Phonetic Zoo FOLDER Directions

## Materials:

- The printouts at the end of this document
- 2 manila file folders
- 2 card stock pages
- Misc. colored paper
- Clear Packing tape
- Spelling zoo cards (to make cages)



## Assembly:

1. Fold both sides of a manila folder to meet in the middle (male-female part). Do the same to second folder.
2. Glue folders "male" parts together (by days of week in picture above). The lap-book base is now complete, now to decorate.
3. Close the folders flat and paste title. You can also raise the title to higher on the page and paste the directions here too.

4. On the first inside fold paste the following (on colored paper)

Pre-fixes, suffixes, days of week, months of year, listen for all the sounds and I added homonym of the week to mine. Done with first page. You can change any of the order of things. You can even print lists of other things to include in this section.

5. On the bottom of the second large fold glue down "A cages". Tape the colored card stock unto the top and bottom of what is now the "A cage" page and attach with clear packing tape. With paper laid down like in the picture below, glue down "O-cages" on top and "Consonant cages" at the bottom.

6. Close bottom flat up and glue down Homonym Corrals (black/brown in picture below)

7. Close top flap down and glue down "E cares"

8. Glue down "Personal spelling list" (cut in to thirds) on the male and female sides as shown above. Your lap-book is now complete.
